
- with a promise: "there you shall be endowed with power

- 168 of these temples have been announced in the past 6 years by President Nelson.
- If that pace continues, there would be over 1,000 temples by 2050.

- Pittsburgh Temple Dedication Sept 15
- In the April 2024 General Conference at least 7 talks were directly focused on temple covenants and worship, including each of the talks by the First Presidency.
- In the April General Conference Leadership session 10 of 14 talks were directly focused on temple covenants and worship.
